Meet your **three guides** at the **Independence Transportation Center** which is just off of Race Street, right before the light at Fifth Street, to tour **Historical Philadelphia** including:

- Independence Hall & Congress Hall where the Declaration of Independence was ratified on July 4, 1776. An original copy is housed here.
- **Liberty Bell** Inscribed with the words "Proclaim Liberty throughout the Land," the bell was rung when the Declaration of Independence was adopted.
- **Declaration House** where Thomas Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence.
- Welcome Park the open city square dedicated to the city's co-founder, William Penn.
- Carpenter's Hall meeting location of the first Continental Congress.
- Franklin Court this imaginative, informative and downright fun museum designed around the site of Ben Franklin's home reflects his wide interests in science, printing and politics.
- **Elfreth's Alley** the oldest continuously inhabited street in the United States. Most of Colonial Philadelphia looked like this street still does today.
- **Betsy Ross House** Where Quaker seamstress, Betsy Ross, is said to have sewn the first American flag.
- Christ Church the tallest building in Philadelphia when built in 1754, the Nation's Church" including among its parishioners, Benjamin Franklin, Betsy Ross, and George and Martha Washington.

Enjoy **Thanksgiving dinner** at the **Moshulu Restaurant**, aboard the largest four-masted sailing ship in the world still afloat. Since launching in 1904, she has worked the ports of Europe, South America, Australia, America and Africa, and was confiscated by the Americans in WWI and by the Germans in WWII. In 1994 she was restored in the style of a turn-of-the-century luxury liner and was re-christened by Philadelphia Mayor Ed Rendell.

Follow I-76 West to the Exit #342 - Girard Avenue. Turn RIGHT onto Girard Avenue to Sedgley Drive. Turn RIGHT onto Sedgley Drive and park along Sedgley Drive. You can also use Lemon Hill Drive also (if needed). DO NOT go as far as Kelly Drive.
